The City and County of San Francisco (City) seeks responses to a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) from certified General Building Contractors (B License) interested in performing general building services at various healthcare facilities in San Francisco, California.

Notices regarding Addenda and other RFQ changes will be posted on the Public Works' website and will also be distributed by email to Plan Holders.

The work will involve general building services at various healthcare facilities in the City, and may include, but is not limited to, repair, alteration, modernization, maintenance, rehabilitation, demolition and construction of infrastructure, buildings, structures, or other real property. Work on facilities may be under the jurisdiction of California's Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development (OSHPD).

The work is performed on an "if-and-as-needed" basis in accordance with the San Francisco Administrative Code Section 6.64(b) requirements. Contractors who can demonstrate experience, expertise and quality of work may be awarded a master agreement for a term of up to two years and not to exceed amount of up to \$2,000,000. The Contract Term may be extended up to 5 years to complete the work of issued CSOs, but no new CSOs will be issued after the first 4 years. When work is available, at least three contractors awarded a master agreement will be invited to submit a competitive quotation for the work. The contractor submitting the lowest responsive quotation may be awarded the Contract Service Order (CSO) to perform the work. There is no guarantee that a Contractor who has been awarded a master agreement will be awarded any CSOs.

No contractor or subcontractor may be listed in a bid or awarded a contract for a public works project unless registered with the DIR as required by Labor Code section 1725.5 [with limited exceptions from this requirement for bid purposes only under Labor Code section 1771.1(a)].

Contractors interested in being awarded a master agreement must submit a cover letter requesting a master agreement for Master As-Needed General Building Services [OSHPD] with the completed RFQ Submittal Package that demonstrates their experience, expertise and quality of work. Submit the information to: San Francisco Public Works, Contract Administration, 1155 Market Street, San Francisco, CA 94103.

San Francisco Public Works will accept requests for a master agreement for this Contract on a continuous basis, but reserves the right to terminate the solicitation at any time. Contractors determined to be ineligible to be awarded a master agreement will be notified in writing within 60 days of their request.

Bid discounts will not apply during the RFQ phase, but will apply during the CSO quotation evaluation phase as per Administrative Code Chapter 14B. The scope of work entails general building services for healthcare facilities. Accordingly, the LBE Subcontracting Participation Requirement on this project will be **15%** of the resulting work under each Master Agreement. Bidders must achieve 80 out of 100 points to be deemed responsive. Bidders will receive 15 points for attending the pre-bid conference, if scheduled. Call Lupe Arreola at 415-558-4059 for details.

Minimum requirements of San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 6 Sections 6.21 and 6.22 requires Contractors to include with their submittals information concerning their experience and financial qualifications, San Francisco Business Tax Registration Certificate, participation in an apprenticeship program and compliance with subcontractor listing laws.

Pursuant to Charter Section 3.105, all contract awards are subject to certification by the Controller as to the availability of funds.

Minimum wage rates for this project must comply with the current General Prevailing Wage as determined by the State Department of Industrial Relations. Minimum wage rates other than applicable to General Prevailing Wage must comply with San Francisco Administrative Code, Chapter 12P, Minimum Compensation Ordinance.

Contractors are hereby advised that Contractors awarded a master agreement must be certified by the Contract Monitoring Division as being in compliance with the Equal Benefits Provisions of Chapter 12B of the Administrative Code within two weeks after notification of award.

The City reserves the right to reject any or all requests for master agreement and waive any minor irregularities.
